The Choir and Hade Edge Brass band got together in mid June to put on a terrific concert at Holmfirth's Civic Hall – a new venue for the Choir in recent years - and quite a success it was, too.

Hade Edge Band, up-and-coming under its current conductor, **Jonathan Beatty**, played from the stage whilst the Choir stood in front on the floor below – a good arrangement to balance the sounds and the volumes of the two ensembles for the items where Band and Choir performed together: beginning with the rousing '**Battle Hymn of the Republic'**, later the very moving Michael Kamen '**Requiem for a Soldier**' and the finale, '**You'll Never Walk Alone**.'





All told the evening provided a rich and varied menu of musical entertainment, which many in the appreciative audience hope we will repeat someday soon. In between came separate spots by both Band and Choir. One Highlight was **Sally Crago's** cornet playing in a new and specially written piece, '**First Light**', which evoked dawn over the Grand Canyon.

Friends, family, Army Veterans and Choir members gathered in great numbers to give him a good send-off at Linthwaite Church on June 23rd.

Younger brother, Barry, talked about his childhood with Roger in Primrose Hill and the family's move to the Colne Valley – an area Roger scarcely left. "One of the best things Roger did for me," said baritone Barry, "Was to introduce me to Colne Valley Male Voice Choir".

First Tenor and dedicated member of the Choir for well over thirty years, one of his last performances was at last July's "Concert on the Hill" but, sadly, he isn't going to make it this year.

Roger, who had been suffering from poor health for many months, was too frail to join in the last Christmas Concert at the Town Hall but retained sufficient enthusiasm to join in as part of the audience.

Concert on the Hill


