Robert Cockcroft wrote the lyrics and music of this little piece,' Beautiful Soup' for his friend, **Keith Swallow**, Colne Valley's maestro of the keyboard. The Choir has been slowly getting to grips with it.

And Robert knows a thing or two about soup. Huddersfield born composer, organist and – for four decades – a newsman, Robert was also, for many years, the restaurant critic for the **Yorkshire Post**.



Here he is extolling the virtues of soup in a 2013 Yorkshire Post article about a Kirkburton eatery. 'The Dyeworks':-

"The chef is a Francophile and has plainly absorbed more than the surface manners of the cuisine he loves.

That became brilliantly apparent in the **onion soup**. I've criss-crossed France in search of good soupe à l'oignon, to be rewarded by feeble brews the colour of silt. Nothing feeble about this: armies could fuel ballistic missiles with it.

Richness doesn't start to describe it. The onions are reduced to a dark stickiness before being conjured into a mahogany broth. Some cheese-topped croutons are set afloat and that's it."

I don't know whether soup will be available at the **Supper Concert**, the Choir is doing at the **Carding Shed** in **Hepworth** on Sunday, June 12th. Nor, indeed whether this deceptively-straightforward little musical piece will be ready for performance by then. But I can assure Readers that it will be an enjoyable evening, with good food and fine musical entertainment from the Choir and our in-house soloists.

Hi John.



Historic Return to Llangollen for Colne Valley Male Voice Choir

The first ever choir to sing at the world-famous Llangollen International Music Eisteddfod is to make a symbolic return to celebrate the festival's 70th year.

Colne Valley Male Voice Choir has scooped six titles at the historic festival over the years as well as five second places and two third prizes - but back in 1947 they missed out. The 70-strong choir, which was founded in Slaithwaite in 1922, was the first to take to the Eisteddfod stage in 1947 and it was up against choirs from Hungary, the eventual winners, Spain, Italy, Denmark and Holland as well as Wales and England.

Now, seven decades later, representatives from the choir have been invited as special guests to the 'Choir of the World' Finals at the 70th staging of the iconic festival. It will mark a symbolic return for the choir which has enjoyed a long relationship with the festival



The Choir of the World competition is now for the Pavarotti Trophy and although Colne Valley missed out on a prize in that first year, they went on to claim **a hat-trick of wins** in the 1960s and have become one of the UK's most successful male voice choirs with a host of titles at home and abroad.

They have sung without music sheets since **Thom Meredith** became the Musical Director as a 23-year-old in 1989 so they have performed more than 300 different songs from memory in 26 years – a feat unlikely to have been replicated elsewhere.

Eisteddfod Musical Director Eilir Owen Griffiths (left) said: "We'd be delighted to see the Colne



Valley Choir here at the Eisteddfod again.

They are part of the history of the event and there will always be a welcome in Llangollen for the choir which started the great tradition of the Choir of the World competition."

Returning to Llangollen will also bring back happy memories for **David Hirst**, the second longest-serving member of the choir who joined aged 22 in November 1960 – just a few months after the first Llangollen success. "Obviously, we have a special association with the Llangollen festival and it would be quite an honour to return", he said. "As well as being the first male choir to sing at the Festival, there was a hat-trick of wins in 1960, 1961, 1962 and altogether there have been six wins, five seconds and two third prizes in the 23 visits by the Choir since 1947. Quite an achievement when you were up against 19 or 20 choirs."




The Choir, which rehearses in **Slaithwaite Conservative Club** on Monday evenings, has only ever had five conductors during its 93 years of existence. The longest-serving was **George Stead** who led the Choir for 44 years and wrote the very popular Psalm 126, which is regularly performed by male voice choirs across the country.

The Choir's official accompanist is **Keith Swallow**, a celebrated solo pianist in his own right, who has been in the role since 1957. The longest-serving member is the **Rev John Radcliffe**, who joined the same year and is also the Choir Chaplain. The youngest singer is **Tom Law**, 24, while **Frank Littlewood** is the oldest at 86.


They have toured France, Germany, Ireland, Czechoslovakia and the USA, some of them exchange visits with choirs arising through relationships built at Llangollen.



Next year's Llangollen event, the 70th to be held, will feature star names Bryn Terfel, Katherine Jenkins and Jools Holland and his Rhythm and Blues Orchestra who will bring the curtain down on the festival on Sunday, July 10



Beer mats



Go for a meal of maybe a pint anywhere in the Colne Valley at the moment and you are likely to rest your glass on a CVMVC beer mat.

Ken Parkin, Colne Valley's recently appointed Publicity Officer is the man behind this bright idea. "We had 2,500 mats made." says Ken, "And then they went to 25 establishments in batches of 100 approx. Most of the beer mats were taken by committee members and I delivered about 1000 myself. We covered most Pubs and Clubs in Marsden, Slaithwaite and Linthwaite plus a few in Golcar and beyond. There are some, of course, downstairs in the Con Club.

The mats were produced by my sons at **Brook and Learoyd Printers**, on Chancery Lane in Huddersfield. They produced the printed design but had to outsource the transfer of this onto beer mats as it is very specialised. The only firm in the country who used to do this was in Milnsbridge but it closed fairly recently and I think these were done in Holland."

"It's all about making sure people know that we are there," says **Vice Chairman**, **Rob Rosborough**, "A bit of brand awareness."
