

Triumph in competition



Colne Valley won the **Brighouse Trophy** and **First Prize** in the male voice choir class at the **Mrs Sunderland Huddersfield Music Festival** on Saturday afternoon.

Wow! Last year we had been well beaten by Will Prideaux's men from Peterborough Male Voice Choir and the competition on Saturday came down to a contest between the two.

We had been backstage when Peterborough were singing but their recent reputation is high and reports began to reach us that they had put in a top-class performance.

Well, the Huddersfield Town Hall is our 'home turf' and we were ready to own the stage. So, if we were going down again it wouldn't be for lack of trying.

And we were pretty wonderful and our Music Committee's choice of repertoire was magnificent!



The Adjudicator, **David Hoult**, took the stage: "**This is between two** excellent choirs," he said. "And either of these two would be worthy winners.

In competition you need both disciplined singing and musicality in performance. The very best show both at the same time! Both these two leading choirs managed to achieve this."

He talked about Peterborough; admiring the way the choir had spread out to confidently fill the space. (We had spread out only a bit – were we to be marked down?)

"Peterborough's first piece, '**Hunker Down**' was simple but effective and richly interpreted. '**Demon in my View**' showed very expressive phrasing.

"One quibble," he added, "Syllabic singing - a tendency to come across as too metronomically accurate in the breakdown of phrases instead of letting the musical quality of a lovely legato line come through." He went on to demonstrate, singing a line at first chopped-up then again in all its musical flow. (He could have been quoting our conductor, **Thom Meredith** who tells us the same thing about 20 times a rehearsal and again in the backstage warm-up. And I thought, - just maybe we are in with a shout here.)



"And now I come to Colne Valley, he said. A bigger choir - didn't need to spread out too far to fill the stage and to fill the hall with a very full sound and lots of musical pleasure and enjoyment. Not that the 'Last Words of David' was 'all welly'. Far from it; there was lots of good detail and dynamic variety - very impressive. 'Joshua fit the battle of Jericho' We all know the story but Colne Valley told us it in a convincing, energetic, disciplined way - beautifully articulated, we could hear every word. Well done.

These are two A grade choirs, he said. So in second place, Peterborough Male Voice Choir "Well, the place erupted because, of course, it meant Colne Valley were the winners. Tom took to the stage to collect the cup to warm applause.

The Editor can't tell you how made up he was to win this, **our 50th First Prize at the Mrs Sunderland.**



And we also won the privilege of singing again in the Choirs of Choirs contest in the evening's gala prize-winners concert.

We did the Goff Richard's **'Let there be Light**' and that stirring, Buddhist anthem. **'We Rise Again**' with star soloist, James Cooke, (seen here, front right preparing to take the stage.)

The evening concert was a joy to be part of – so many excellent performances from individual prize-winners and choirs. The Colne valley men sang well, we enjoyed ourselves and we entertained the crowd.

In the Editor's view one Choir stood out head and shoulders above the rest of us. That was from **The Chanterelles**. And clearly there was not mush room for doubt in the adjudicator's mind, either, for he awarded them top spot in the Choir Challenge and the prize for best single item of the day. They were very entertainingly choreographed, waving their fans in the Spanish number, 'El Vito' and they sang with great skill and precision.


And I would walk 500 miles.....


