




### Special event at St Paul's

### My Life in Music

Trevor Bowers, new second tenor (& already a veteran) tells VotV about his singing history

I was born in Linthwaite in 1935, the youngest of three brothers and joined Linthwaite Church choir at 7 years old. Among my older peers there were former choir members, **Norman Dearnley**, **Hubert Sykes**, and **Philip Baxter** and a very hard Choir master called Gledhill Sykes.





At the age of 15 we moved to Bradford, where I joined the choir of St Mark's, Low Moor. My voice never broke and I sang soprano till the age of 18. I was then called up for National Service and served in the **RAF 208 Squadron**, Middle East.

Whilst in **Malta**, I had the chance to study with **Oreste** - all paid for by the RAF. Oreste (Kircop) was quite a famous tenor, who later replaced Mario Lanza in one of his films '**The Vagabond King**'

On return to 'Civvy Street', I had singing lessons from Charles Wood in Leeds, a base-baritone, who could sit at the piano and sing from bottom D to top C, and was very strict. I used to ride there on my on my bike in all weathers.

At the age of 21 I was self-employed with a shoe shop at Low moor. But I kept up with my singing in Operatic Societies in Brighouse, Bradford, and Halifax

I then got on to the Club circuit and was very successful for about 20 years. Batley Variety Club was one of my favourites. With having staff in my shops I was able to do this, without going full time.

I then bought a shop in Sunderland and ran it with my wife. So I was able to work the North east clubs for another 5 years.

They were hard audiences but it was very rewarding.



(Incidentally, writes VOTV Editor, John Clark, Trevor was not alone amongst CVMVC members who once spent time, singing on the 'Club scene'. David Hirst did it quite successfully, as did Ken Farr. And, still at it, are James Cooke and Steve Uttley who still do regular gigs with Frank Sinatra standards. That's not to mention Simon Durrans and Tom Law on the rock & pop scene.)

I then sold my shops and became a fulltime fundraiser for **The Stroke Association** and one of my ways of raising money was to sing at residential homes, WI meetings, Townswomen's Guilds etc. in return for donations to the charity. Unfortunately my wife died of leukaemia and I returned to Yorkshire, settling in Cleckheaton, near my family.



I continued singing at residential homes and other places and I was lucky enough to meet a lovely lady called Beth at the **Ritz Ballroom**, **Brighouse**. (Now, sadly, forced to rename as 'Venue:73' - the Ritz Hotel in London apparently fearing the competition).

We got married and joined Whitechapel Church at Cleckheaton, where we joined the choir and had 11 happy years together. Once again tragedy struck and Beth was killed in a road accident in Huddersfield. I was on my own again.

So I joined Westfield Male voice Choir where I met **Basil Hirst** and we sang together for many years. Basil was also a member at Colne Valley Male Voice Choir.

When we had to disband due to lack of membership, Basil said to me, "If you're going to join another choir, join the best."





So here I am with CVMVC and really enjoying it.

I also play and sing in two ukulele bands.
