A bit bothered about parking?

Voice of the Valley is aware, that some potential audience members are a bit bothered about parking, ever since the Council Car Park just beside the Town Hall was demolished a while back. Well, you don't need to be concerned, there's plenty of parking within a short walk of the Town Hall (and if you need be you can drop frailer concert-goers off by the Corporation Street entrance before you park).

Remember there is probably plenty of on-road parking available after 6.00 pm but if you prefer - as most do - an off-road car space, there are still plenty. Here's the information you need:-

Here are options for over 800 free parking places for the Sunday evening (after 6pm) on the evening of the concert. Please check when you park that they still remain FREE.


Nearest & best option for those with mobility issues- Free on Sunday - (114 spaces)












Well it made me smile....


