

# Kilimanjaro Joe - seeks sponsorship money for next LAMS Project

On Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> June, Choir Chairman, **Joe Stones** set off to climb Africa's highest peak, **Kilimanjaro**. This is very high - 19,341 feet high (5895 metres).

Here we see him and his pal, lan, their guides and support teams in the foothills of Mount Kilimanjaro at an early stage in their ascent attempt.



The idea came about when Joe and his friend, Ian, were approaching their 50<sup>th</sup> birthdays. They made a plan to climb the peak but work commitments at the time meant this never happened. Fully ten years later, for their 60<sup>th</sup> birthdays, they revived the plan and committed themselves to the adventure of a lifetime. They would finally take on the challenge waiting for them in Tanzania.

Joe says, "We are climbing via the **Lemosho Route**, which is longer but allows more time for acclimatisation. We chose this, because the very high altitude of the mountain means there is only half the usual level of oxygen at the top, so the longer, more gradual climb seems wisest. This route is also well renowned for its spectacular and changing scenery from rain forest and jungle at the bottom to snow, ice and severe cold at the top, even in June!

Me and lan are both experienced walkers and we also ski usually twice a year, so we reckon the biggest challenge will not be the changing temperatures nor distances we'll need to trek but we will be more bothered about the altitude and the thin air, which is more difficult to prepare for.

We have been preparing though, both of us walking regularly, recently climbing Helvellyn via Striding Edge, and other peaks in the Lakes and Dales. A couple of weeks ago, my wife, Judith, and I were in Snowdonia continuing to prepare."

"They were in the forested foothills foot-hills on Tuesday....



...and spent Thursday night at Lava Tower Camp in the National Park.



By Friday, their ascent was really making progress. They were trying 'The Barranca Wall' in readiness to attempt to summit.



VotV was astonished to get these photos from Joe but he did say mobile phone coverage was getting increasingly poor, so we don't know whether he's made it!

What a change. Eh? When your Editor lived in Africa it took an air-mail letter about a month to get to England if it arrived at all - and I doubt there will be any post offices on Kilimanjaro.

#### Not just a jolly!




Just before he left, Joe told VotV that he has fully funded his trip but said that people were regularly asking him what charity he was raising money for?

"I had not thought of that at the time" he adds, 'But then I thought about the community singing project Colne Valley Male Voice Choir has been running for men, who like the idea of singing with other men but currently, probably, only sing in the shower.

I had been closely involved, with Choir colleagues in January to March this year with the Project, called 'Let All Men Sing'".

The initiative was launched as one of Colne Valley Male Voice Choir's Centenary Year Projects. The idea was to get a group of men together for just 8 rehearsals in order to do a one-off concert in support of Men's Mental Health charities. The project was remarkably successful. The LAMS men did a wonderful concert, singing alone and with the Colne Valley Boys and the adult Choir, building on our links with the community and raising some money for the charity, ANDYSMANCLUB (which works to prevent male suicide through positive mental health).



"It was a huge success." Joe said "And we had nearly forty men from absolutely all walks of life, ages and backgrounds taking part.

Because it was such a success story, people are already asking the question: Will we be running the 'Let All Men Sing' community choir again next year?

Quite a number are wanting to take part especially those that were unable to be involved last time.

The project costs around £2000 to run.

I've decided to make that my Kilimanjaro Charity.

Every penny I raise will go to support for 'Let All Men Sing' for 2024 and even 2025 if we raise enough.

The Choir was honoured to have Lt Col Barney Barnbrook visit our rehearsal the other Monday.


He had come specially to formerly receive a donation to the ABF - The Army Benevolent Fund

For the Choir it was a wonderful event.



He presented the choir with a plaque to mark our donation.



He hinted that the Band would welcome a chance to come back again sometime in the not too distant future. Let's hope it works out!






## Colne Valley Boys in concert


#### Adrian becomes life member
