

## Good Day at the 'Mrs Sunderland'



Colne Valley Male Voice Choir returned to the Competition Stage at the **Mrs Sunderland Music Festival** this year after a period of renewal and rejuvenation. We did so in a joyful spirit, hopeful but unconcerned about results. What mattered was that we sang as well as we could and that our newer members would get a taste of competitive performance on the grand stage at Huddersfield Town Hall. No matter that our large choir came second to the select men of Peterborough. We beat them in the next class with a fine second place behind **Peterborough Voices** - another fine ensemble, this time of female singers.



Our adjudicators said this of us....

Of 'Luck be a Lady' the judge, in the MVC Choir Class 94 congratulated, "A fantastic solo", (by Tom Law) "which led into the main section which had all that 'swagger'. He added "Excellent diction with clear accents that made the performance sparkle."

Of the 'Last Words of David', he said, "A really strong opening and then an amazing pp.... lovely sense of 'mysticism' which led to the benediction at the end. A wonderfully musically-compelling performance!"

Our Second adjudicator, **Andrew Padmore**, commented on the (non-gendered) Choir Programme Class 96, "A great number of choral techniques were required and employed. (in **Invictus**). It was performed with a sense of assurance and authority.

"Ave Maris Stella demonstrated the choir's sensitivity in accompanying the soloists. Absolutely beautiful pianissimo singing conveyed the sacred aetherial mood of the music admirably."

"In your final piece, (Sway) you demonstrated an understanding of this Spanish-influenced composition."

"A well chosen programme displaying variety and the ability to embrace many choral techniques."

Our judgement is we've got some way to go but this year's participation demonstrates 'great steps forward'.



And well done, too, to **Lindley Community Choir** who were also winners in the 'Local Choir' class.

Incidentally it was also a good day for our sister choir, 'Marsh Ladies' which features the partners of some of our CVMVC members. They won their class and the Joseph Hancock trophy – well done.

### Spring by the Canal


Could it be that spring is really on its way? VotV sees the early signs.
